

FOR THOSE INTERESTED IN APPLYING FOR THE POST OF

DIRECTOR

BLOC Productions is looking for an experienced, energetic and enthusiastic Director for its production of *We Will Rock You* at The Bristol Hippodrome between 25th – 29th August 2026.

The person appointed will lead the artistic vision, set the production ethos and have the capability to maintain BLOC's reputation for the highest possible production standards.

BLOC Productions:

BLOC is a non-professional company that has been dedicated to performing Light Opera and Musicals for ninety years. It is currently the only non-professional company that performs once a year at The Bristol Hippodrome. BLOC has recently been the lead Club in the UK amateur premier production of *Les Misérables*, was the first Company to be offered the rights to *Evita* by The Really Useful Company and one of the first companies to be offered *Chitty Chitty Bang Bang*. In 2022 BLOC brought *Elf – The Musical* to the Hippodrome stage for the first time and it played to sell out audiences every performance.

Under the Chairmanship of Phil Hallworth, the Company is managed by a Committee of Trustees which collectively acts as Executive Producer. A Producer is appointed by the Committee to work closely with the Production Team and the Hippodrome management, to ensure the smooth running of the production.

Recent productions have included *Sister Act, Sunset Boulevard, Fiddler on the Roof, My Fair Lady, Chitty Chitty Bang Bang* (which won The Rose Bowl Award for Best Musical), *Elf – The Musical, A Christmas Carol* (which also won The Rose Bowl Award for Best Musical) and *Me and My Girl*.

The Bristol Hippodrome:



The Hippodrome is owned by ATG and is one of their Number One Touring venues. It was designed by Frank Matcham in 1912 and seats 1,957 on three levels. The stage facilities include a fly tower. Each year it hosts a large number of large-scale touring shows. Candidates must convince the interviewing panel of their ability to direct a show in a large and prestigious professional theatre.

The Company:

To be a performing member of BLOC one has to audition. Once selected, all performing members are eligible to participate in the current show. So cast sizes have varied from 40 – up to 80 if children are also involved! For *We Will Rock You* we expect the company will be about 40.





The Director and Creative team need to be aware that not all performers are a triple threat (acting, singing, dancing) and dealing with the diversity of enthusiastic talent and ability within the club is an important skill that all members of the Production team need to have. All members of the ensemble will undertake vocal and movement assessments before their involvement is established and casting finalised. The successful candidate will be able to demonstrate a professional, friendly and approachable personality.

Principals:

Aspiring principals are auditioned by a panel including the Director. All performing members are eligible to audition.





BLOC always attracts the very best of local talent to audition for these roles and performance standards are exceptionally high.

Set:

Sets are now usually hired; however, in the case of *Chitty Chitty Bang Bang, Elf – The Musical, A Christmas Carol and Les Misérables* we designed and built our own set, including an award-winning flying car! The Director will be expected to have an input into set design/hire. For example, as many sets are touring sets, some thought as to how to make them appropriate for the size of the Bristol Hippodrome stage may be required.

Production Team:

The Creative team comprises Director, Musical Director and Choreographer, each with an Assistant. The Director will be appointed first and they will be involved in the appointment of the Musical Director and Choreographer.

There is superb technical backup in all departments and the possibilities are only limited by imagination or, more realistically, by budget constraints. The team comprises of a Production Manager, Stage Manager and Heads of Department (Lighting, Sound, Costumes, Make-up, Properties etc.).

Rehearsals:

These will begin in February when the Director and Creative team will outline their vision for the show to the Company and explain the audition process for principals and assessments for the ensemble.





The company rehearses on Mondays for Company numbers and on Wednesdays for Principal Scenes. For four weeks before the Show there are also all-day Sunday rehearsals.

Rehearsals take place at The Newman Hall from 19:30 - 22:00.

Show Week:

Get in: Sunday 23rd August

Technical set-up: All day Monday 24th August

Technical Rehearsal: Monday 24th August 18:00 – 22:45

Dress Rehearsal: Tuesday 25th August 13:00 – 17:30

Opening Night: Tuesday 25th August 19:30

Then Performances are Wednesday matinee, Wednesday evening, Thursday evening, Friday evening, Saturday matinee, Saturday evening.

Support:

There will be ongoing support from the Committee, the Producer, the Production Manager and the Production Secretary who is the main conduit of communication between Production Team, cast and crew.

Applications:

We would welcome applications from candidates who are able to provide evidence of a demonstrable commitment to the quality and professional standards expected of BLOC Productions, and on which our reputation is founded.

Interviews:

Short-listed candidates will be informed by 4th October and invited to attend for a one-hour face-to-face interview with a panel on:

Saturday 11th October sometime between 10:00 – 17:00.

Ideally, the successfully candidate will be available to join the Panel for interviews with potential Musical Directors and Choreographers the following week, **Saturday 18th October.**

Fee:

The fee may be discussed at interview. It will be commensurate with experience and is subject to our budget parameters.
